- YES Prop 133: Require Partisan Primaries Amendment This measure will amend the Arizona Constitution to require partisan primary elections for partisan offices. A response to the Make Elections Fair Act, which would turn primaries into nonpartisan contests.
- YES Prop 134: Signature Distribution Requirement for Initiatives -This measure will require signatures from voters in each Legislative District in Arizona, not just the largest populated areas, to put an initiative on the ballot that changes state statutes or constitutional amendments.
- PROP 135: Emergency Declarations Amendment to the Arizona X NO Constitution granting the governor emergency powers in 30 day increments, which the state legislature can indefinitely
- YES PROP 136: Arizona Legal Challenges to the Constitutionality of Initiatives Amendment - Amends the Arizona Constitution to allow legal challenges regarding the constitutionality of proposed initiatives before they go to the ballot.
- PROP 137: End Term Limits and Retention Elections X NO for Supreme Court Justices and Superior Court Judges Amendment. Gives judges lifetime appointments and removes them from the ballot. Voters should have the right to decide.
- PROP 138: Wages for Tipped Workers Amendment Allows X NO employers to decrease the wages of tipped workers up to 25% per less than minimum wage.
- PROP 139: Right to Abortion Initiative Provides full term abortion, removes parental rights, medical doctor not provided.
- PROP 140: Single Primary for All Candidates Installs jungle X NO primaries/Rank Choice Voting.
- X NO PROP 311: Establishes Criminal Conviction fee to be donated to 1st Responder Death Benefit Plan - Vague in implementation, another government money grab.
- YES PROP 312: Property Tax Refund for Non-Enforcement of Public Nuisance Laws Measure.
- YES PROP 313: Life Imprisonment for Sex Trafficking of a Child Measure.
- YES PROP 314: Immigration and Border Law Enforcement.
- YES PROP 315: Adds oversight of Legislative Ratification of Excessive Regulatory Costs Measure.
- X NO PROP 479: Extends Maricopa County Transit Tax for 20 years!
- PROP 486: Expenditure limit of the Maricopa County Community College District established in fiscal year 1979-80 be permanently adjusted by \$52,841,755.
